

AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO THE COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

THE CITY OF NEW ORLEANS

AND

TEXAS A&M AGRILIFE EXTENSION SERVICE

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT (the "Amendment") is entered into by and between the City of New Orleans, represented by LaToya Cantrell, Mayor (the "City"), and Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service, (the "Texas AgriLife Extension"). The City and Texas AgriLife Extension are sometimes each referred to as a "Party," and collectively, as the "Parties." The Amendment is effective as of February 2, 2023 (the "Effective Date").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, on February 2, 2022, the City and Texas AgriLife Extension entered into a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement for the valuable public purpose of generating a database of existing rodent and environmental data that will be used to make informed rodent management operational decisions for Centers of Disease Control and Prevention Grant Award 5 NUEIEH001421-02-00 (the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the City and Texas AgriLife Extension, each having the authority to do so, desire to enter into this Amendment to extend the term of the Agreement for two (2) years and to increase the Agreement's compensation; and

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the City and Texas AgriLife Extension amend the Agreement as follows:

1. **Extension.** In accordance with Article IV, Section (B) of the Agreement, the term is extended for an additional two (2) years from the Effective Date through February 1, 2025, and NUEIEH001421-03-00 and NUEIEH001421-04-00 are attached as Exhibit A-1, and hereby incorporated into the Agreement. During the Amendment's term, Texas AgriLife Extension will perform services outlined in the scope of work, attached as Exhibit C-1, and hereby incorporated into the Agreement.

2. **Funding.** The funding described in Article III, Section (A) of the Agreement, for the period of February 2, 2023, through February 1, 2024, is increasing by \$12,000.00, and for the period of February 2, 2024, through February 1, 2025, is increasing by \$12,000.00 in accordance with the Exhibit D-1 attached to this Amendment, and hereby incorporated into this Agreement. Payment is contingent upon the appropriation of funding from the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention, and Texas AgriLife Extension's timely submission of quarterly invoices in accordance with Article I, Section (B) of the Agreement. The maximum amount funded by the City under this Agreement is \$52,684.00.

3. **Special Conditions for CDC Non-Research Contracts.** The "Special Conditions for CDC Non-Research Contracts," incorporated into the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention Grant Award 5 NUEIEH001421-03-00 and NUEIEH001421-04-00, are expressly incorporated into this Amendment as Exhibit A-1 and effective immediately, as the City has

indicated it will or may seek funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in connection with the work to be performed under this Agreement.

4. **Audit and Other Oversight.** It is agreed that Texas AgriLife Extension will abide by all applicable provisions of City Code Section 2-1120, including but not limited to City Code Section 2-1120(12), which requires Texas AgriLife Extension to provide the Office of Inspector General with documents and information, directly related to performance of this Agreement, as requested. Failure to comply with such requests shall constitute a material breach of the Agreement. In signing this Amendment, Texas AgriLife Extension agrees that it is subject to the jurisdiction of the Orleans Parish Civil District Court for purposes of challenging a subpoena.

5. **Cost Recovery.** In accordance with Section 2-8.1 of the Municipal Code entitled "Cost recovery in contracts, cooperative endeavor agreements, and grants," to the maximum extent permitted by law, Texas AgriLife Extension shall reimburse the City or disgorge anything of value or economic benefit received from the City if Texas AgriLife Extension fails to meet its contractual obligations.

6. **Convicted Felon Statement.** Texas AgriLife Extension certifies that it complies with City Code Section 2-8(c). No Texas AgriLife Extension principal, member, nor officer has, within the preceding five (5) years, been convicted of, or pled guilty to, a felony under state or federal statutes for embezzlement, theft of public funds, bribery, or falsification or destruction of public records.

7. **Non-Solicitation Statement.** Texas AgriLife Extension certifies that it has not employed nor retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for it, to solicit or secure this Amendment. Texas AgriLife Extension has not paid nor agreed to pay any person, other than a bona fide employee working for it, any fee, commission, percentage, gift, or any other consideration contingent upon or resulting from this Amendment.

8. **Prior Terms Binding.** Except as otherwise provided by this Amendment, the terms and conditions of the Agreement remain in full force and effect.

9. **Counterparts.** This Amendment may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original copy of this Amendment, but all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same agreement.

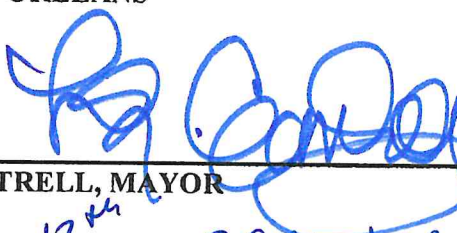

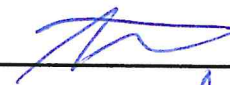

Title: "A community-based rodent surveillance collaborative to address data gaps and prevent health effects".

Award Date: February 2, 2023 - February 1, 2025

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service proposes to collaborate with City of New Orleans (primary) and University of Miami to participate as co-collaborator for developing an environmental health and pest control workgroup that will determine what information that needs to be collected to address rodent populations and possible disease transfer to humans. This is especially important when it comes to trending zoonotic diseases and natural disaster events.

CoPI J. Hurley will work with local and state health agencies to seek participation in data collection, determine gaps in TX and then translate those outputs back to stakeholders within the state. This exchange of information will be internal (Extension) and external (Dept of State Health Services, Dept of Agriculture, Restaurant Associations, etc.). As data as learned and collected, Hurley will then disseminate this information out to TX registered sanitarians and others as educational opportunities are offered.

Travel to cities within TX to visually inspect areas that potentially have high rodent populations to determine what data points are needed to measure an increase in rodents in areas that can impact economically disadvantaged areas.

Travel to New Orleans and other states regarding the evaluation process of this project and support educational outreach efforts for in person trainings for pest management professionals, registered sanitarians, and other environmental health workers.

Conduct a comprehensive environmental scan in collaboration with internal (e.g., state, tribal, local, and territorial (STLT) health agencies) and external (e.g., business, industry, public) partners and stakeholders to compile a collection of relevant needed rodent data (e.g., rodent-borne diseases, 311 rodent service calls or complaints, inspections) to make local data publicly available and to improve STLT health agencies and other stakeholders' data-driven decision making and to be more adept when addressing potential zoonotic transmissions and enhance potential for a more unified response to rodent infestations in urban areas.

Evaluate findings for continuous program quality improvement as needed. Janet Hurley, ACE will also assist in the development of the dissemination channels and audiences, as well as in evaluation findings and in the development project presentation and a peer reviewed paper summarizing the results of the data finding and gaps that will enhance the ability of managing commensal rodents.

Texas is home to the CDC Western Gulf Center of Excellence for Vector-Borne Diseases. Dr. Sonja Swiger, Extension Entomologist, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension oversees the Center's outreach and

education efforts. Leveraging the contacts and members of this Center, this group will work with this project to help increase our efforts to educate about rodent and rodent borne diseases.

For this project Hurley will participate for each of the Activities outlined in the narrative:

1. Activity 1 Hurley with other PIs to organize and host collaboration meetings to solicit additional participants and to determine what data will be collected.
2. For Activity 2, Hurley will collect data as requested by a collaborative group for the state of TX. She will work with local health authority contacts in the large urban areas (Dallas, Houston, Austin, San Antonio) to gather data. This data will be in written and verbal formats.
3. For Activity 3, Hurley will work with the collaborative to disseminate the information through email, in-person, and social media outlets to further implement IPM and rodent monitoring as Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), The National Association of County and City Health Officials (NAACHO), and National Environmental Health Association (NEHA) have designed.
 - a. Using the established TX rodent academy further that outreach with public health officials to elevate the working relations of everyone in TX.
 - b. Incorporate the current TX program of educating city and county personnel with the public health license, work with the mosquito – vector groups to add rodent education as part of an ongoing curriculum.
 - c. Use current networks of PMPs to link to city/county programs public health programs with citizen education.
 - d. Conduct specialized trainings throughout TX to help disseminate information on better ways health departments can engage communities to understand their role in rodent behavior.
